#### **French Horn**

- Bachelor 1:
  - Two études, such as Maxime-Alphonse, 3rd movement, or Kopprasch, movements one and two
  - Two recital pieces from different stylistic periods
- Bachelor 2 & 3:
  - Two technical études, to be chosen by the candidate from the methods listed below
  - Two melodic études, to be chosen by the candidate from the methods listed below
  - One recital piece (preferably with piano accompaniment), to be chosen by the candidate from the solo works and/or concerti on the exam repertoire list

Methods: Gallay, Muller, Kopprasch, Maxime-Alphonse (second and third book)

### Saxhorn

- Bachelor 1
  - One technical etude,
  - One melodic etude,
  - Two recital pieces, at least comparable to fourth grade level of music academy. Two different styles, if possible with piano accompaniment.
- Bachelor 2, 3
  - One technical etude,
  - One melodic etude,
  - Two recital pieces, to be chosen from the solo works and/or concertos of the exam repertoire list. Two
    different styles and with piano accompaniment if possible.

#### Trombone

- Bachelor 1:
  - Two études (one to be technical, one to be melodic), for example Kopprasch, Bitsch, Boutry, Pederson (tenor trombone), Pederson, Smits (bass trombone)
  - Two recital pieces from different stylistic periods
- Bachelor 2 & 3:
  - Two technical études by Kopprasch
  - Two melodic études by Rochut
  - One recital piece (preferably with piano accompaniment), to be chosen from the solo works and/or concerti on the exam repertoire list

#### Trumpet

- Bachelor 1:
  - Two études (one to be technical, one to be melodic), such as by Arban, Charlier, Vannetelbosch
  - Two recital pieces, different styles
- Bachelor 2 & 3:
  - Two technical études to be chosen from the methods set out below
  - Two melodic études to be chosen from the methods set out below
  - One recital piece (preferably with piano accompaniment), to be chosen from the solo works and/or concerti from the exam repertoire list

#### Tuba

- Bachelor 1, 2 & 3:
  - 1 work with piano: e.g. andante and allegro (capuzzi), cappriccio (Newton), suite for tuba (Vaughan)
  - 2 études: 1 lyrical (e.g. Bordogni, Concone, ..., ...) 1 melodic (e.g. Blazevich, Vasiliev, Grigoriev, ...)
  - Knowledge keys and triads major and minor

## French Horn

For all levels:

- Two technical études, to be chosen by the candidate from the methods listed below
- Two melodic études, to be chosen by the candidate from the methods listed below
- One recital piece (preferably with piano accompaniment), to be chosen by the candidate from the solo works and/or concerti on the exam repertoire list

Methods: Gallay, Muller, Kopprasch, Maxime-Alphonse (second and third book)

## Saxhorn

For all levels:

- One technical etude,

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- One melodic etude,
- One concerto and one recital piece, to be chosen from the solo works and/or concertos of the exam repertoire list. Two different styles and with piano accompaniment if possible.
- 3 orchestra excerpts, to be chosen of the exam repertoire list.

#### **Trombone**

For all levels:

- Two technical études, to be chosen by the candidate from the methods listed below
- Two melodic études, to be chosen by the candidate from the methods listed below
- One recital piece (preferably with piano accompaniment), to be chosen from the solo works and/or concerti on the exam repertoire list

Methods: Rochut (melodic), Kopprasch (technical)

## **Bass Trombone**

For all levels:

- Concertino by Ernst Sachse
- One melodic étude of the candidate's choosing
- One technical étude of the candidate's choosing

## **Trumpet**

For all levels:

- 3 orchestral traits: Léonore signal 2 & 3, Carmen prelude, Painting exhibition promenade
- 2 etudes of which one technical and one melodic, e.g. Arban, Charlier, Bitsch
- 2 recital pieces with different styles, one from baroque or classical period

### Tuba

For all levels:

- 1 concert with piano: e.g: Vaugan Williams, Lebedjew, Koetsier, Gregson, ...
- 3 studies: 1 lyrical (e.g. Bordogni, Concone), 1 melodic (Blazevich, Vasiliev, Grigoriev, ...), 1 low etude on C or BBb tuba (e.g. Phil Snedecor)

- orchestral traits on f/es and c/bes

#### **POSTGRADUATE**

### POSTGRADUATE INSTRUMENTAL CONCERT SOLOIST

Candidates must prepare a programme with a duration of a minimum of 30 minutes, with at least two representative works from a least two different stylistic periods.

#### **POSTGRADUATE ORCHESTRA**

Candidates must prepare a programme with a duration of a minimum of 20 minutes, with at least two representative works from a least two different stylistic periods. In addition, they must prepare four orchestral excerpts.

### **POSTGRADUATE CHAMBER MUSIC**

Candidates must prepare a programme of 30 minutes with representative works from at least two different stylistic periods, of which at least one is a solo work and one is a chamber music work. The solo work must be performed from memory.

# 4. Entrance exam subsidiary and auxiliary instruments

French horn, trumpet, trombone, tuba and saxhorn:

- one technical étude
- one representative recital piece or a melodic étude

Specific methods which are representative of the required level:

- for trombone and tuba: études by Kopprasch and Bordogni/Rochut
- for French horn: études of Maxime Alphonse (first or second book); études of Gallay (études for second horn); études of Muller
