EXAMS

Before an external jury:

Two jury members from abroad and teachers from three different countries

The candidate:

- must play repertoire in progressive order (10 books spread over 5 levels).
- must have mastered all Suzuki Teaching Points from the level presented, including those from the previous levels, and is capable of answering questions about the previous levels.
- must know all pieces (for the level presented) from memory, including the Suzuki method Teaching Points of all pieces.
- must give an exam lesson to a pupil from the level which the candidate is undertaking.

Assessment standards:

- Philosophy of Dr Suzuki – The student must demonstrate that he or she has mastered the philosophy of Dr Suzuki and that he or she can apply it in daily life and while teaching the instrument.
- Performance – The student must be able to demonstrate the principles, technical and musical points of the Suzuki method in his or her own playing.
- Teaching – The student must have knowledge of the Teaching Points on the instrument, and must be able to demonstrate/explain/apply them.
- At least one month before the start of the exams, the student must submit written documents such as book reviews, observation hours and Teaching Points from the relevant level.

- Level 1 (year 1) 30 minutes
- Level 2&3 (year 2) 50 minutes
- Level 4 (year 3) 60 minutes
- Level 5 (year 4) 60 minutes

Teaching Methodology Initiation to Music (3 ECTS)

Exemptions for Teaching Methodology

Students may get an exemption for *Teaching Methodology Instrument and Introduction to Physical Awareness* if they already have a pedagogical certificate for teacher training for the relevant instrument, or a diploma in music teaching.

Students may get an exemption for *Teaching Methodology Initiation to Music* if they already have explicit credits for *Teaching Methodology Initiation*, for example in the specific teacher training course from the Royal Conservatoire Antwerp.

Exemption on the basis of an ESA 1 or ESA 2 certificate

Students with an ESA 1 or ESA 2 certificate from the Suzuki association may get an exemption from the following courses:

- Suzuki as the mother-tongue method 1 (3 ECTS)
- Suzuki pedagogy 1 (6 ECTS)
- Teaching coaching 1 (3 ECTS)
- Observation placement 1 (3 ECTS)

Total: 15 ECTS

A master's diploma will not entitle students to an exemption for Research Project 1 and 2, as this is a two-year course on a specific facet of Suzuki teaching with a progress report after one year.
