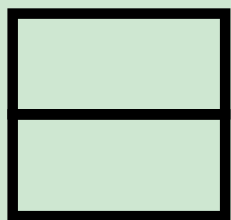

History

The Royal Academy of Fine Arts was founded in 1663 by David Teniers the Younger and constituted the fourth academy of fine arts worldwide. It became part of AP University of Applied Sciences and Arts in 2013 and has been operating as a unique entity under this umbrella ever since. Research at the Academy is done in collaboration with ARIA, Antwerp Research Institute for the Arts / University of Antwerp. There are currently around 600 students and researchers registered at the Academy, from about 50 different countries worldwide. This guarantees a truly inspiring and enriching international experience for everyone involved.

1. STUDENT EXCHANGE - All study programs (except fashion)

You can select your study program by picking a variety of courses from one of the offered degree programs. An exchange can be for one semester or for one academic year.

2. STUDENT EXCHANGE - European project semester (EPS)

In AP's European Project Semester (EPS), students will work with an international and interdisciplinary team of four to seven others on project challenges provided by companies and non-profit organizations (often in close cooperation with AP research groups). EPS significantly enhances students' competences in project-based collaboration, cross-cultural communication, entrepreneurship and English language proficiency. Students who successfully complete the program will be awarded 30 credits.

APPLICATION PROCESS FOR AN INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE

Procedure

Partner institutions need to send us an official nomination. All **exchange students** need to submit an application, accompanied by the required documents (see below).

Required documents

1. Application Form
2. Portfolio (only digital)
3. Letter of motivation
4. Confirmation from home university selected as Erasmus student

Academic year

Autumn semester: **September – December**

Application deadline: 1st May
(Selection and approval before 1st June)
Exam in January

Spring semester: **February – June**

Application deadline: 1st November
(Selection and approval before 1st December)
Exam in June

3 exhibition spaces

Besides studios, the library, practical and theoretical premises, the Academy also has some special exhibition areas.

The Lange Zaal (*The Long Hall*) was built in the 19th century as part of the academy museum.

The Winter Garden, actually a covered cloister garden, is a flexible presentation platform.

The Temple is a beautiful neo-classicistic building designed by Pierre Bruno Bourla (under renovation at the moment).

Library

The **library of the Royal Academy of Fine Arts Antwerp** combines a selection of modern books and journals on every aspect of the visual arts with a unique historical collection which dates back to the 17th century.

Housing

Studentkotweb, a unique database developed for students in Antwerp, offers a continuously updated database of 5,000 approved student rooms. Student services **Stuvo AP** also has some interesting student rooms in private management within walking distance of Roosevelt Square (Rooseveltplaats) and Central Station.

Budget

Estimated cost of living (varies between study programs):

- Room: €400/month
- Utilities (water, electricity, internet, fire insurance): €200
Please take into account that these amounts can vary and are subject to market fluctuations.
- Registration city hall: €25
- Bike rental: €100/year
- Living costs: €400-500/month
- Rent deposit: €800 (2 months' rent)
- Study materials: €100/semester (varies depending on study program)

Visa and insurance

International students who are staying in Belgium for more than three months, have to apply for a residence permit or make a 'declaration of presence' after arrival.

AP University of Applied Sciences and Arts helps international students with applying for their residence permit.

Visa and insurance

All information on the procedures for a residence permit via AP can be found on the AP website.

There are 4 procedures which you can follow:

1. Students from a **neighbouring country or the UK**;
2. Students from a **EU/EEA country**;
3. Students from a **non-EU/EEA country**;
4. Stay of **1 semester** (for Erasmus students from a EU/EEA country).
