2. STUDENT EXCHANGE - European project semester (EPS)

In AP's European Project Semester (EPS), students will work with an international and interdisciplinary team of four to seven others on project challenges provided by companies and non-profit organizations (often in close cooperation with AP research groups). EPS significantly enhances students' competences in project-based collaboration, cross-cultural communication, entrepreneurship and English language proficiency. Students who successfully complete the program will be awarded 30 credits.

Housing

Budget

Estimated cost of living (varies between study programs):

- Room: €400/month

- Living costs: €400-500/month
- Rent deposit: €800 (2 months' rent)

Visa and insurance

International students who are staying in Belgium for more than three months, have to apply for a residence permit or make a 'declaration of presence' after arrival.
