1 Admission requirements

Candidate students holding a bachelor's diploma in Visual Arts, awarded by the Flemish Community, with a corresponding main subject and competency profile, will be granted direct admission to the master studies in Visual Arts.

Candidate students holding a bachelor's diploma in Visual Arts, awarded by the Flemish Community, with a different main subject and candidate students with a different bachelor's diploma, can be admitted to a preparatory or bridging programme after going through the admissions procedure.

Candidate students with a bachelor's diploma with a corresponding main subject and competence profile, obtained abroad (or in the French Community) can be admitted to the master studies in Visual Arts after completing the admissions procedure.

Candidate students with a bachelor's diploma with a different main subject and students with a different bachelor's diploma, obtained abroad (or in the French Community) can be admitted to a preparatory or bridging programme after completing the admissions procedure.

2 Admission procedure

2.1 Administrative fee

To take part in the admission procedure for the master programme, candidates must pay a nonrefundable administrative fee of 25 euro, to be paid in advance online.

2.2 Registration and payment

Registration for and payment of the admission procedure for the master programme is possible online via the website <u>https://www.ap-arts.be/opleiding/bachelor-en-master-de-beeldende-kunsten/inschrijven#Master</u>.

Candidates need to upload their portfolio, and a detailed curriculum vitae, a motivation letter, a proposal for the master project and all the degree copies obtained after secondary school as indicated on the website.

2.3 Timing

The procedure for admission to the Master of Visual Arts is organized twice per academic year for the following academic year, with the exception of the Fashion study program.

A first session will take place in March (interviews in April/May), a second session will take place in August (interviews in September)

A candidate student can only participate once per academic year in the admission procedure for one study programme or different study programs only at separate registration per study program.

Candidate students from outside the EEA are strongly advised to participate in this first round. Candidate students outside the EEA must submit their application for a student visa as soon as possible after admission, and at the latest in July. Only then will they have the visa to attend classes from the start of the academic year.

2.4 Assessment

Artistic entrance examinations are assessed by a committee.

2.5 Composition of the committee

Every committee is made up of at least two members of the teaching staff of the associated main subject/choice option linked to the Royal Academy of Fine Arts Antwerp and 1 external member. Members of the committee are prohibited from participating in the assessment of an artistic entrance examination of a spouse, a partner or a (blood) relative down to the fourth degree.

2.6 Committee report

A report will be drawn up detailing the committee's activities, including the date, the decision taken and the motivation. This document is signed by the members of the committee, submitted to the student files administrator.

2.7 Publication of the committee's decision

Any decisions taken by the committee is made available to the concerned candidate students in an e-mail sent to the address they provided within 7 calendar days counting from the date of the decision.

2.8 Enrolling as a student

Candidate students who have passed the application procedure for the master programme can only enrol if they meet all general admission requirements and language requirements as described in the currently applicable Education and Examination Regulations.

Candidate students who have passed the entrance examination will receive an e-mail with all the details for further processing of their application which they can use to enrol for the coming academic year or the one after that.
