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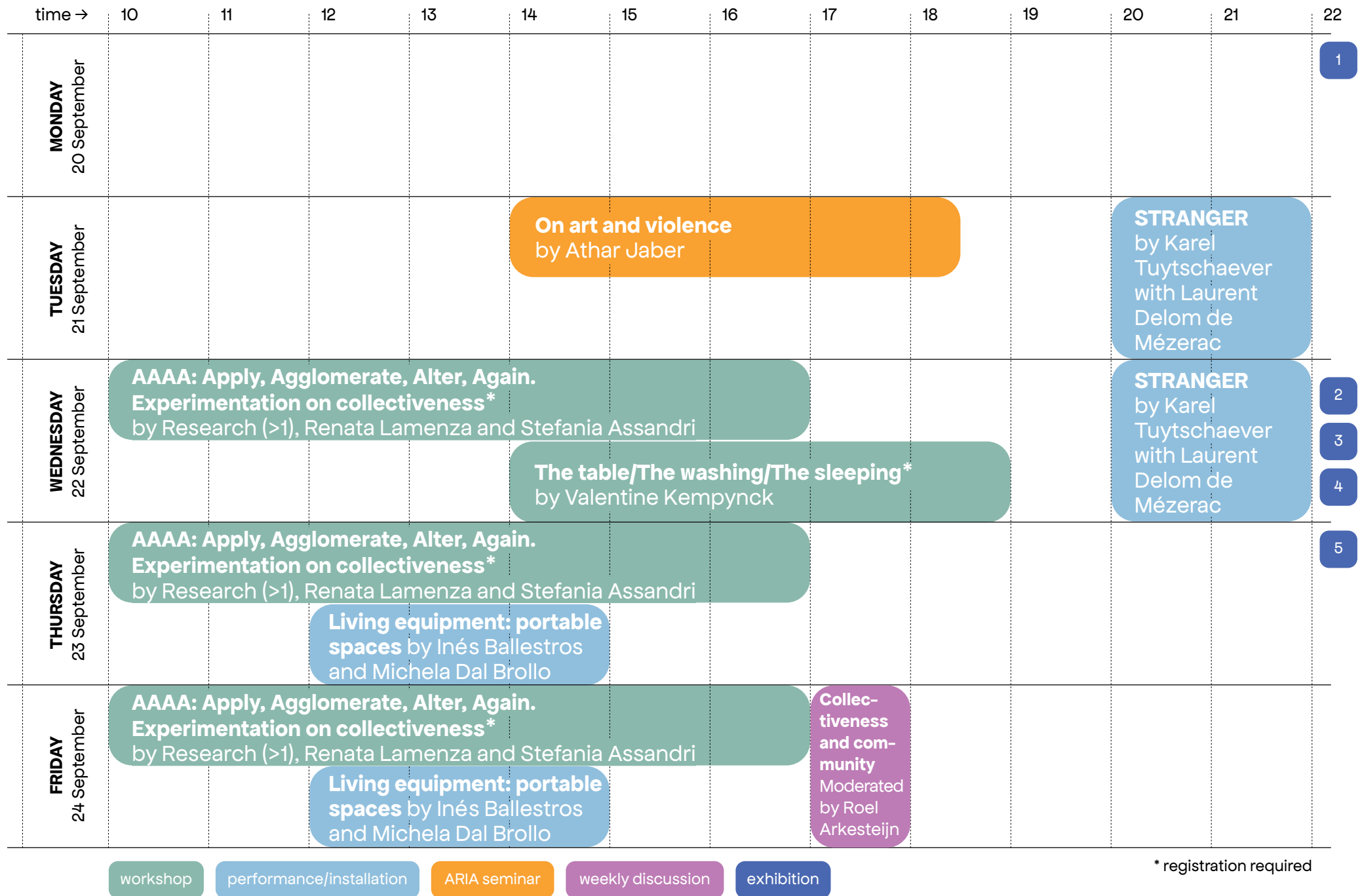

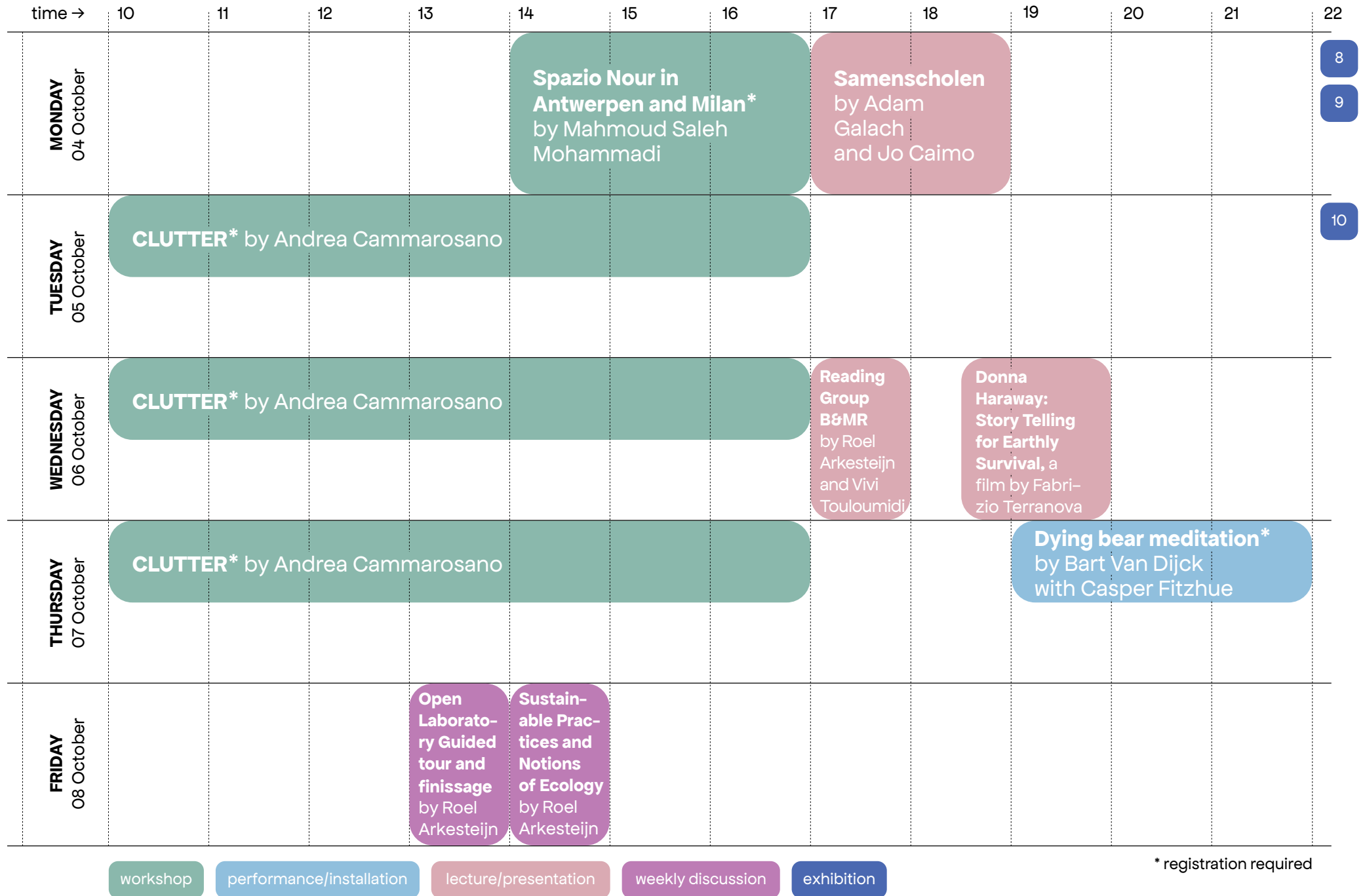

In daily rituals we make actions of the human body unconscious, in memory of the body. These movements make themselves. They are our nature our signature. Our physical experience goes before the thinking. We can find trust in this base, in this instinct and lean on it. This work takes our human actions as an exploration of our reality. The work has two installations:

1. The table is an installation with projection and in front of it a table made of soap. People can clean the table and see their print. It is an active installation that is permanently reachable from the start. It doesn't grow or change during the exhibition.

2. The washing: When you wash yourself, in fact you align yourself, you draw yourself. Washing is respecting the body, the body that made your body the body that made the body of your body. You can graft this moment as a contact with the ancestors. You deepened your daily ritual, so the memory of the body can take care over you now.

With *Lams Kardan*, Lies wants to question ownership and reciprocity in art. How can participants have an equal voice in the process and the artistic outcome of a participatory art project? How can a community of 100 people be the author of one artwork? And can people derive a sense of social connectedness by participating? *Lams Kardan* starts a dialogue with a large group of people on tactile textile experience and experiments with new forms of social connectivity.

Participants are first invited to consciously touch, feel, smell a round old linen tablecloth, then choose a thread: thick, thin, wool, cotton, silk, and a color, and a needle. Next they are asked to improvise and make an abstract embroidered work on this tablecloth, a sort of personal textile signature. Each embroidery action has to start from touching another textile signature. This tablecloth got passed down to another person and that person follows the same protocol. After the ritual, Lies asks each person to reflect in the logbook about their experience: thoughts, feelings, emotions, memories, drawings, everything you would like to share... This work in process will remain installed until 8 October, and will continue afterwards on other public locations.

Spazio Nour in Antwerpen and Milan

How can we, as artists, use participative art to positively influence (complex) social realities? For the past decade, Mahmoud has been organizing participative art performances in his home in Viale Bligny 42, a notorious building in the city center of Milan, infamous for its crime, poverty, immigration, drugs... People were not interacting with each other and bad became worse. Thanks to Mahmoud's participative art, very slowly but strongly people started interacting and trusting each other more. Eventually, the whole atmosphere in the building changed for the better and he opened my cultural organization, "Spazio Nour". Last year, the artist brought "Spazio Nour" to "Merksem Dok", a neighborhood in the north of Antwerpen where a lot of different nationalities live, but do not interact together, he started organizing participative performances/events again, as well as in Borgerhout.

In this workshop Mahmoud will introduce interested parties to my practice and explain what "Spazio Nour" entails with examples of some projects both in Milan and Antwerpen e.g. Empathy Benches, Empathy Flags, Love is Univers ALL. At the same time he will show how anybody can bring their creations in any form into the society through participation. Let's share the beauty and spread a positive impact in Antwerpen and beyond, through the arts. The importance of artists within society, bringing their work to the people, should not be underestimated.

It is a remarkably impressive range, from a thinker with a nimble and curious mind. *Donna Haraway: Story Telling for Earthly Survival* is a clever and insightful glimpse into the thought of a major contemporary figure.

On art and violence

“Stone sculpture is oft the material of choice because of its durability ../.. However, it has also been implemented as a faithful assistant for the enforcement of systemic violence”. This is an extract from the PhD text part by Athar Jaber to introduce this seminar organized in collaboration with the University of Antwerp, more specifically the Antwerp Research Institute for the Arts (ARIA) and “Omkadering Jonge Onderzoekers” (OJO). It will focus on the topic of Violence in a broader sense and on its representation in Art in particular. International specialists, both academics and artists, will talk about their work, discuss with each other and with the audience.
